1. Bug fixes

1.1 Backdated repayment transaction cannot be posted prior to Arbitrary fee applied transaction on Fixed loan accounts

Users were unable to post repayment transaction having the back date before some existing arbitrary fee transactions. This happened because the arbitrary fees could not be bulk-reversed, recalculated and then reposted.

This problem occurred only in case of Fixed loan accounts and it is now fixed.

1.2 Improve get repayments for loan account database retrieval

Attempting to retrieve repayments for loan accounts caused some low response times on small-to-medium tenants, because the database requests were executed multiple times.

This issue is now fixed and retrieving repayments will no longer causes such problems.
